This is why we are concerned about increasing polarisation, physical and verbal violence, hate speech, intolerance, social isolation of marginalised groups, erosion of human rights advocacy and radicalisation of various groups of society. We believe that it is necessary for both private and public spheres to become safe spaces for dialogue.

We want to encourage civic participation, and promote activities that bring people with differing opinions together rather than divide them. We aim to help like-minded initiatives learn from each other and to encourage new ways of cooperation between them. - Provide support for civic and political actors. Create and implement trainings that build capacity of civic actors for dialogue and non-violent action;
- Encourage responsibility in the media, online and offline communication.

Our initiative started as a cooperation between European civic actors who were concerned about polarisation across societies. Increasing misunderstandings between people, growing hatred towards one another, the inability to understand "others" and diminishing quality of public dialogue have left us concerned about the future we will be facing. Together we aim to contribute to the depolarizing societies by promoting initiatives that lead to non-violent communication and coexistence of different groups.
